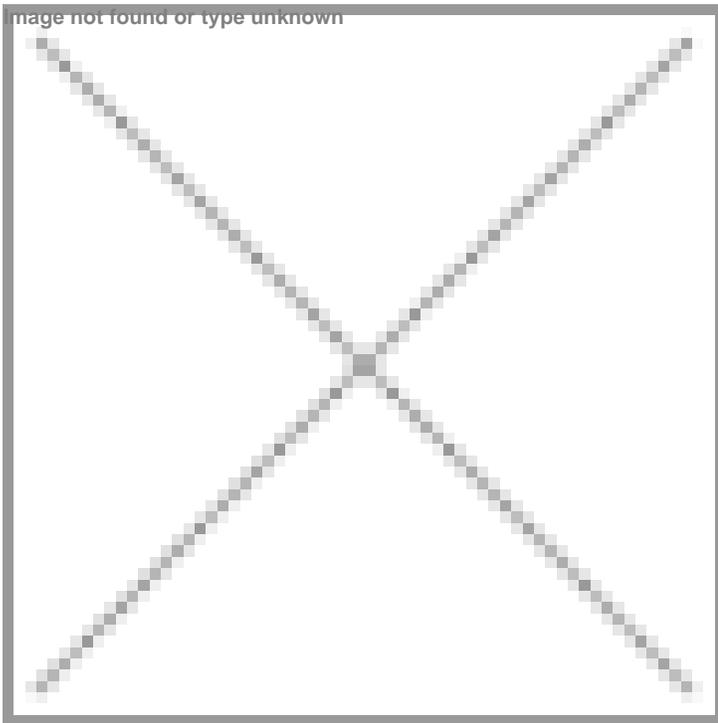


## Redcliffe Labs issues preventive healthcare advisory amidst rise in COVID-19 cases

What's important is timely action. We advise individuals not to ignore early symptoms such as cough, fever, or severe body aches.
